Social Housing Investments in Budget 2016

What will the Government of Canada do to help preserve units for low income households living in social housing when operating agreements expire?

Budget 2016 includes meaningful short-term investments that will preserve affordability for low income households in social housing as operating agreements expire.

- \$30 million for subsidies for CMHC-administered social housing.
- \$504 million to double the Investment in Affordable Housing (IAH) delivered through provinces and territories.
- \$574 million to renovate or retrofit existing social housing.

CMHC will renew subsidies for all federally administered social housing projects with operating agreements expiring in the next two years on a transitional basis until the end of March 2018.

- CMHC will contact housing providers to execute agreements to renew existing subsidies until the end of March 2018.
- Housing providers will be required to maintain or increase the number of rent-geared-toincome units for low income households.

- For federally administered projects where operating agreements expired prior to April 1, 2016, funding from the IAH can be used.
- Housing providers should contact provincial/territorial housing agencies to enquire about funding.

Significant federal investments provide a source of funding so that provinces and territories can extend subsidies for social housing projects they administer.

- The doubling of the IAH (\$504M) in addition to current funding for the IAH (\$476M) provides just under \$1 billion in federal funding that can be used to protect affordability for low-income households for projects where operating agreements will end in the next two years.
- Housing providers should contact provincial/territorial housing agencies to enquire about funding.

The investments in Budget 2016 are a transitional measure to bridge the next two years while consultations are undertaken leading to a new approach under a national housing strategy.

 The Government will consult with provinces and territories, Indigenous and other communities and key stakeholders in the coming year to develop a national housing strategy for the longer term.
