

End of operating agreements: the essential checklist UPDATED

This updated workshop will briefly review current challenges, but will mostly focus on the future: What will be the critical issues facing your co-op? What resources do you need to tackle these? Human rights claims can be costly, divisive and time-consuming for co-op housing providers. Learn how to avoid, assess, and resolve these claims expeditiously through sound policies, proactive responses, and effective use of legal counsel.

6 Interviewing and member selection

Aside from critical credit checks and referencing, how do you determine which membership applications to accept? Come along to this practical workshop to learn about behavioural based interviewing techniques. Leave with a set of questions that will help you make the right member selections for your co-op.
