Territory Acknowledgement


Squamish, Musqueam and Tsleil-Waututh Peoples unceded territory

So much of BC is unceded territory, it is important to recognize the First Nations people whose land we occupy.


1791 First time BC First Nations lands were being surveyed and on the East Coast it was much earlier times.

- First meeting put forward a recommendation to CHF BC
- Diana Day facilitate this group

Indigenous Caucus Recommendation

THAT CHF BC work with Kaslo Gardens Housing Co-op and other interested members to learn more about the lived experience of Indigenous people in housing co-ops in British Columbia.

THAT this work include:

- an examination of the supports (or lack of support) available to Indigenous people experiencing discrimination or racism in co-op communities and the resulting impact on their experience of equity and inclusion in those communities;
- an assessment of the tools, strategies and resources needed to better support Indigenous co-op members as full and equal participants in their co-op communities

We presented this recommendation to CHF BC and were pleased that this recommendation will be addressed by the CHF BC

Social Justice Issues

- Governance and communication workshops ie) non violent communications and trauma informed community building
- Anti-Racism committee it affects us all
- Environmental justice issues piloting an e-cargo bike co-op
- Dedicate 5% of our co-op units to youth aging out of care
- Developing a mutual aid hub to promote neighbourhood based community organizing, aligned with CHF BC Active Community Resilience Initiative
- All of which is grounded in decolonization work

Kaslo CAN Committee - Mandate

- Coordinate educational events regarding the cooperative economic movement and social and environmental justice issues
- Coordinate educational events to support capacity among Kaslo members in inclusive community decision making processes and community organizing to address social and environmental justice issues within and beyond our co-operative

Decolonizing our Co-ops

- Implementing territory acknowledgements before meetings
- Actively recruiting First Nations, Metis and Inuit co-op members
- Recruit First Nations, Metis and Inuit members to your board of directors and have First Natiosn, Metis and Inuit members on each committee.
- Join Kaslo CAN
- Implement education workshops on Truth and Reconciliation
- Allocating a percentage of units to First Nations, Metis and Inuit
