## About the Task Force

The Climate Emergency Task Force started in 2019, as a response to a resolution adopted by members at our Annual General Meeting. Our committee plans and develops resources and activities that encourage housing co-ops and their members to engage with environmental sustainability.

- Made up of people from CHF BC member organizations, board directors, and CHF BC staff
- Committee members meet every 4-7 weeks, with an average of 6-8 meetings per calendar year
- Meetings are held in the evening on weekdays, with virtual and hybrid options available
