What do advisory committees do?

Advisory committees convey community perspectives to City Council and staff while advising on City priorities, projects and initiatives. They are essential to the City's public engagement efforts, and are often asked for early and ongoing feedback on specific projects relevant to their mandates.

Most advisory committees meet once a month at City Hall to discuss issues, receive information and presentations and give advice and recommendations. Virtual/online attendance options are also available. Meetings may be attended by Councillors, staff, or representatives of organizations like the Park Board or the Vancouver Public Library. Meals are provided at meetings held over lunch or dinner hours, and members of certain committees are eligible to receive reimbursement for dependent care, parking and travel expenses when attending meetings.

Successful applicants will receive orientation and training from City staff. Some basic expectations are that members will:

- Treat all committee members and other participants with dignity and respect;
- Understand that advisory committees have no formal decision-making authority; and
- Only take on what they are able, recognizing that volunteer members are not expected to do the work of staff.
